Its objectives are to:

- 1) Strengthen the institutional capacity of the Ministry of Regional Development to design and execute drinking water projects in vulnerable communities in the interior of Suriname;
- 2) Provide access to clean and safe drinking water that meets national standards for 100% of households in the Maroon community of Asigron; and
- 3) Improve drinking water management and storage capacity in Asigron

Asigron, Brokopondo: This small village is situated along the Suriname River, near the old – now inactive- oil palm plantation of Victoria. The community counts 57 households and 283 inhabitants.

- The project will install rainwater harvesting systems and storage tanks
- Selected community members will be trained in the installation and maintenance of the water harvesting system
