


## Progress in NAPs

#### More and more countries have launched their first NAP

- 22 developing countries have submitted NAPs as of June 2022
- 126 developing countries have launched NAP processes
- Many more are finalizing NAPs this year
- As more countries complete their NAPs, need to ensure a transition to implementation



## The transition from planning to implementation

### A growing gap?


- Many intermediary steps between planning and action – demotivating
- Can lose momentum and undermine credibility of NAP process
- Need to manage expectations anticipate and plan for the transition
- Recognize that a whole new set of actors and skills may be needed


## Examples of activities in the transition

### Have a list of priorities – now what?



- Making the right people consistently aware of adaptation priorities: Communications strategies
- Translating a priority in specific actions, steps: Concept notes
- Designing projects or programs: Feasibility studies, capacity needs assessments
- Determining how much money is needed: Costing adaptation actions
- Figuring out where the money will come from: Financing or resource mobilization strategies
- Accessing finance: Proposals, donor pitches, government budgeting
- Identifying who is responsible for what, by when: Implementation strategies
- Getting the right people or partners on board: Outreach and engagement strategies

# Enabling factors for implementation



Enabling factors for planning may look different from that for implementation requires new types of:


- Financing scale, sources
- Capacity development
- Institutional arrangements
- Information sharing

## Ethiopia

### Implementation Roadmap


Ethiopia launched their NAP in 2019, which identified adaptation measures to be implemented between 2019 and 2030.

## Developed an Implementation Roadmap to:



- Identify key enabling activities instrumental to implementing the NAP, their timelines, and key milestones – in collaboration with key actors responsible for their delivery.
- Facilitate the implementation of NAP actions
- Identify needs and gaps in adaptation finance.

## Saint Lucia



#### Action Plans, Concept Notes

- Overall NAP document accompanied by
  - Sectoral Adaptation Strategy and Action Plans (SASAPs)
  - Associated project concept notes
- Agriculture SASAP used to inform the a proposal to the Adaptation Fund.
- The USD 10 million, four-year project designed to build the resilience of the country's agricultural sector through interventions on water security, soil conservation and management, capacity building, and knowledge transfer.

## Colombia

### Pilot project design






- The water sector adaptation plan prioritized the development of an Early Warning System (EWS) to help prevent heavy rains and drought from negatively impacting household water supplies and sewage systems.
- This, in turn, will ensure access to clean water and improve the quality of life in the town of Guatavita and in places where the EWS may be scaled up in the future.

## Fiji

### Roadmap for translating a NAP priority into fundable needs



- Fiji's NAP explicitly calls for the enhancement of meteorological and hydrological infrastructure
- Development of a roadmap of actions for strengthening the country's hydromet observation equipment and services
- The roadmap lays out the specific needs for strengthening Fiji's hydrometeorological infrastructure and services
