










































NAP Readiness and Preparatory Support Proposal









Bhutan's NAP Proposal



- "Preparation of a National Adaptation Plan for Bhutan, with a focus on the Water Sector"
- Budget: **2,999,859 USD**
- Duration: 48 months (4 years)
- National Designated Agency : Gross National Happiness
 Commission
- Lead Agency: National Environment Commission Secretariat
- Delivery partner: United Nations Development Programme

Challenges in NAP Proposal Preparation



Challenges

- Unavailability of guidelines in the beginning
- Formulation of new guidelines after submission of proposal
- Lengthy submission and approval process
- Development of detailed activity breakdown and cost estimates for four years
- Lack of human resources and technical capacity

1.2 Learning and understanding for climate risk informed planning of decision makers improved

1.3 Knowledge management systems to strengthen climate responsive planning

Coordination issues in data management, lack of broader participation and lack of inventory of initiatives

Outcomes

Outcome 2: Technical capacity enhanced for generation of climate scenarios and impact assessment

Sub Outcomes

- 2.1 Assessment of gaps and needs in the data and information requirement for adaptation planning done and scenarios prepared
- 2.2 Capacity across research institutions, scientific community and universities enhanced

Barriers

Lack of data and information, low understanding and general awareness of climate change adaptation issues.



Lack of comprehensive result based monitoring and evaluation mechanism and baseline
