

The FRDP - Goals and what is it



❖Goals:


- 1. Strengthened integrated adaptation and risk reduction to enhance resilience to climate change and disasters
- 2. Low-carbon development
- 3. Strengthened disaster preparedness, response and recovery

What is it?

- ❖ An integrated approach to address climate change and disaster risk – succeeds the 2 separate regional frameworks – PIFACC and the Pacific Disaster Risk Reduction and Disaster Management Framework for Action;
- Guideline for voluntary action for all stakeholders;
- ❖ Non-prescriptive and non-political;
- ❖ Reflects unique circumstances of SIDS;
- Emphasizes that climate change and disaster risk are development challenges;
- ❖ Supports implementation of national plans
- Living document
- Applies to natural hazards and climate change

National adaptation planning in the Pacific



- FRDP provides an exhaustive list of priority activities to guide all actors
- Goal 1 of the FRDP: Advocate the use of an integrated approach to adaptation and disaster risk reduction
- Adaptation priorities vary from country to country
- Adaptation planning processes also vary from country to country depending on the best fit for purpose
- Tools use to inform decisions on actions/measures to undertake is applied for both adaptation and disaster risk reduction for example CBA

Update on national adaptation plans



- None of the Pacific countries have developed NAPs using the UNFCCC's NAP Technical Guidelines
- However, the elements of this technical guideline have been followed and used by the PICTs to develop JNAPs, CC Policies and Strategies
- Joint National Action Plans (JNAPs) Kiribati, Tonga, Vanuatu, RMI, Cook Islands, Niue, Tuvalu
- Some countries have mainstreamed CC and DRM into their national development agendas – Samoa, Fiji, Solomon Islands
- Stand-alone CC and DRM Policies FSM, PNG and working towards an integrated policy
